

Master of Arts in Marriage and Family Therapy (MMFT)



The master of arts degree program in Marriage and Family Therapy (MMFT) at Pfeiffer University is offered at the Charlotte and Raleigh-Durham campuses and provides the clinical and academic training for becoming a licensed marriage and family therapist (LMFT) working with individuals, couples and families in a variety of professional settings. The curriculum, which requires 69 hours and usually takes 3-4 years to complete (contingent on a full-time or part-time commitment), includes clinical training that focuses on developing ethical therapy skills, increasing professionalism and building community partnerships.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- · Completed Pfeiffer University application
- Baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university; minimum undergraduate GPA of 3.0 in major/2.75 overall; nine hours of coursework in the social sciences
- Official transcripts from all previous colleges or universities attended
- Three letters of professional recommendation written on official letterhead and each submitted with the recommendation form (letters from friends, colleagues, pastors or therapists are not accepted)
- Satisfactory completion of the Graduate Records Exam (GRE) with a minimum score of 3.0 on the writing section.
- Current resume and writing sample
- Small group interview with Admissions Committee approval
- Early application deadlines are February 1 and March 1 for summer and fall admission, respectively. However, the program will continue to accept applications until the cohort is filled.
- The MMFT program is a residential program and requires students to be enrolled in a minimum of two courses each fall and spring semester and a minimum of one course during the summer semester.
